A direct descendent of them is for example Reba Candace Cooper, née Willrich of Lousiana who tries to get together a travelling group of US-relations to our clanmeeting at Berlin in this year. We hope very much that she will be successful.

The existance of the discussion for values of a long time is documented by a lot of quotations. So Oscar Wilde said about 100 years ago: Today all do know the price, but not the real worth. This seems to be very actuel. Also the saying of Lothar Wegener belongs to it: Rules are the spelling of democray.







Frauenkirche Dresden

This is a protestant-Lutherian barocque church. In Europe it is one of the most architectonic and protestantic religious buildings. The greatest sandstone building of the world is covered with the greatest stony domed roof northern the Alps. This church was built 1726 to 1743. 1945 Febr. 13-14 it was damaged by bomb attacks and the fire-storm after that. 1945 Febr. 15 the church collapsed. The ruin got a memoral of the GDR. After the end of the GDR it was rebuilt from 1994 to 2005 in the same architectural style financed by patrons, and donations world-wide. 2005 Oct. 30 with ceromony and service the Frauenkirche was once again dedicated. This building may be now a sign of reconciliation and a memorial against war.

History

Chronicle of the Wilrich/Willrich clan since 1595 to 1930 Extract of the family book compiled by Anna Willrich, Oberweimar

In the last family news no. 30/2005 a report of Helene Homann-Willrich was printed about the worries of Wilhelm Christian Willrich (1765-1831) about his son Georg Karl (1798-1876). Two of these letters were written to ask for granting a loan out of the family-cash to his son Georg. They are in the "Nachrichten" reprinted. Here I try to translate these letters as well as possible. Letter 3 is directed to Mr. Bostelmann for the marriage of Georg Karl with his daughter. Whom he married at Uelzen 1821, October 14.

First Letter: To the patrons of the Assen-Holtheyer'schen Stipendiums at Braunschweig. Most humble request of the judge Wilhelm Christian Willrich of Uelzen 1816, August 1 My son Georg Wilhelm has left the school of Uelzen and is going for studying law at university in Göttingen. He is in your care, and I am shure of his integrity to be worth to get the grant. The Assen-Holtheyer'sche Stipendium is a family grant to that my family belongs too. The register of renting out will prove it. For my brother August Willrich, tenant farmer in Bulllendorf at Lüneburg, and the procurator of law August Keuffel, son of my sister widowed cashier Keuffel at Wolfsburg have got the grant. So obient to you I request the grant for my son Georg Willrich for studying law at the university in Göttingen and to acknowledge me.

W.C. Willrich

Second letter: Sir pawnbroker's administrator allow me to remind you of the grant for my son. The expenses for the education of my children are overwhelming me. As soon as I get the investory document I am able to receive an advance. So I respectfully request you urgently for sending this document to me.

1819, July 1

Your faithfully W.C. Willrich

Third letter of Wilhelm Christian Willrich to Mr. Bostelmann in Lüneburg, your honour, highly respected Sir.

Heartily I thank you for your high regarded letter from first of this month. It is my principle to work honestly. So I am obliged not to deceive honest and noble parents. I must confess the truth. My son (Georg) is without fortune. Last year he was 23 years old, easter he ended studies and it seemed for him to have the prospect of earning 600 Thaler in his office. I do know his principle not to use the fortune of his wife. He is undemanding. Gertrude is domestic. The housekeeping of a student is not so expensive and I am shure that within this year a wife will be supported. In this case let us give our parental blessing and conceptance to their marriage. Convey my respects and those of my family to your wife and remain your homour obedient servant.

Deutsches Auswandererhaus - German Emigration Center



Over 7 million emigrants gathered in Bremerhaven between 1830 and 1974 to board a ship headed for the New World. The German Emigration Center is located on the site where the ships departed from the European mainland. It is Europe's largest Theme Museum specializing on the topic of emigration. Elaborate reconstructions and multimedia productions are used to illustrate a trip through time and the history of emigration which spans two centuries. Come face to face with emigrants and their living descendants today. In addition, the German Emigration Center focuses on current aspects of global magration and provides visitors the opportunity to trace their roots.

The journey begins: The trip back in time begins ins the reconstructed Waiting Hall of the North German Lloyd Shipping Lines.

Bidding farewell: A harbor scene dating back to 1888. The fast steamer *Lahn* is preparing to cast off. The imposing ship's side moves slightly up and down. Emigrants stand huddled on the quay amid a sea of baggage, the din of voices and strange noises. The moment has come for them to bid their country and loved ones farewell and to venture into a life unknown.

On Board the ship: There is slight wave action as we walk up the gangway to board the ship. A sailing ship, a fast steamer, an ocean liner – passengers decks from three eras of shipping illustrate how steerage passengers fared during the transatlantic crossing. Begin in cramped and stuffy steerage quarters, move on through dormitories, cabins and dining halls.



The Arrival in New York: Ellis Island, the largest receiving Station in the United States, the Statue of Liberty rising in the background. A total of 16,5 million people passed through the *Island of Tears* between 1892 and 1924, their fates decided by the Inspector's acceptance or refusal.

The Gallery of the 7 Million: Why did they leave? The Gallery of the 7 Million provides the answer – the historical, political and personal motives behind emigration during the 19th and 20th centuries. Become acquainted with the emigrant accompanying you through the exhibition.

Forum Migration focuses on specific aspects of migration today. Visitors may research their ancestors, trace their roots in the largest international genealogical databases, and inquire into current immigration requirements.

Ocean Cinema: Listen to emigrants and their decendants tell their personal stories in the international film production *Welcome home*, produced especially for the German Emigration Center. What did they experience on arrival? What was it like living in a foreign country? A moving documentary, shown at the museum's film theater.

Visiting this museum we found some of our ancestors, but they are noticed also in the same kind within the "Deutsches Geschlechterbuch", Vol. 109. Within the few handwritten passangers lists we did not find members of our clan. Who will travel to Bremerhaven should have the time to visit this museum.

The not so comfortable crossing of the Atlantic Ocean to America in the 19th century in the article may not put us off to visit the USA in the next year.



Our fly to New York and Texas may be more comfortable. In the family news no. 30 of Nov. 2005 cousin Peter-Th. Wilrich explained his proposals. Completing them his plan here:

Outward fly: 2007, May 3, Thursday to Houston.

Participation in the family reunion 2007, May 4 to 6.
